

FIELD NOTES OF SURVEY NO.

Report of a Private Survey made in Section 19, Township 31 South, Range 15 East of the 6th P.M. on the 31st day of July and the 1st day of August A.D. 1879 for W.P. Brown. = On the 11th day of July 1879 received the following order as per Order Book Order of Survey No 73. Surveyors Office Independence, Montgomery Co. Kansas July 11th 1879. Alf Savage Surveyor. You will at your earliest convenience and according to law survey my land lying in Sec. 19 Township 31 South and Range 15 E. of the 6th P.M. = You will also notify Reuben Baker, C.L. Daugherty, J.A. Hatcher of such survey who are interested in the corners of my land = Signed W.P. Brown. Elk City, Ks.
 In accordance with the above order on the 3rd day of July I issued and on the 3rd day of July I served the notices on the interested parties as required by law the following is a true copy of the same. = To Reuben Baker, C.L. Daugherty, J.A. Hatcher and W.P. Brown = You are hereby notified that I will be at the residence of W.P. Brown on the 31st day of July 1879 at 10 o'clock A.M. for the purpose of surveying the lands of W.P. Brown lying in Section 19 Township 31 Range 15 E. of the 6th P.M. = Dated at Independence Kansas this 3rd day of July 1879. = Alf Savage Surveyor of Montgomery County State of Kansas

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 Montgomery Co. I do remember that on this the 31st day of July 1879 personally appeared before me Alf Savage a Surveyor in and for said County, James Brown and David Bucher Chained in a survey made in Sec 19, Township 31 - Range 15 E. of the 6th P.M. and were by me duly sworn to faithfully, impartially and to the best of their ability and skill to discharge their respective duties = Alf Savage Surveyor of Montgomery County, Kansas

On the 31st day of July 1879 in accordance with the above Order and notice I proceeded to survey and divide up said Section 19. = In corner on the range line between Ranges 14 and 15 in Township 31 S. being all lost I went to the closing corner on the 6th Standard parallel and found the stone properly marked with the top lying on the ground, on digging down I found a stone and setting the two together I made one continuous stone = Resumed at the closing corner on the 6th Standard parallel between ranges 14 and 15 in Township 31 South and ran South on a random line between Sections 1 and 6 $10^{\circ} 15' E.$ at 4000 Set Temporary Corner = 8000 Set Temporary Corner = 12000 Set Temporary Corner = 16000 Set Temporary Corner South between Sections 13 and 18 $10^{\circ} 18' E.$ = 2000 Set Temporary Corner = 2400 Set Temporary Corner South between Sections 19 and 24 $10^{\circ} 20' E.$ = 260 Set Temporary Corner = 280 Set Temporary Corner = 320 Set Temporary Corner = South between Sections 25 and 30 $10^{\circ} 25' E.$ = 400. Set Temporary Corner = 478.50 Intersected the Township line 16 links West of the corner to 31 and 32 in range 14 15 N 1 West on true line between Sections 31 and 36 $10^{\circ} 25' E.$ = 79.80 Found true point for corner to Sections 31 and 36 $10^{\circ} 25' E.$ 25, 30, 31 and 36 and dug down and found a piece of lime stone which correspond in width and thickness with stone described by the Field Notes of the Government Survey = 119.70 Found true point for 4 corner between Secs 25 and 30 and found stone which was covered up by washes = 159.60 Found the true point to the corner to Sections 19, 24, 25 and 30 N West between Sec 19 and 24 on a true line $10^{\circ} 20' E.$ = 199.50 Found true point for 4 corner between Sections 19 and 24 and set a lime stone $19 \times 10 \times 3 = 219.45$ Found true point of the NW corner of the South 2 of the NW 4 of Sec 19 and set stone $22 \times 20 \times 3 = 239.40$ Found the true point for the corner to Sections 18, 19, 19 and 24
