

Road Petitioned for by J M Parker and others.

Order on Road Petition

AND NOW, On this 8 day of Dec, A. D. 1908, being one of the days of the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, begun and holden on the 8 day of Dec, A. D. 1908, there was presented to said Board for their consideration, a petition signed by J M Parker and 23 others, praying for the Vacation of a certain road, hereinafter described.

The Board do find as follows: First—That said petition is a legal one, and is signed by at least twelve householders of Montgomery County, Kansas, residing in the vicinity of the road prayed for. Second—That the proper bond required by law has been filed, signed by J M Parker as principal and Joseph McNeil and Matt Griffin as sureties, which said bond is by the Board approved.

THEREUPON, The Board orders that a view and survey of said proposed Vacation be had on the day of Jan, A. D. 1909, and appoints J N Bradshaw and Frank Harding, three disinterested householders of Montgomery County, as viewers of said road, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor of Montgomery County, at the same place of Beginning, in Liberty Township, and proceed to view and survey the same, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof, as the law directs.

The Board further orders the County Clerk to prepare for publication, in the official newspaper of the County, a notice which shall contain a correct and pertinent description of said proposed Vacation of road, which said notice is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ROAD NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That on the 8 day of Dec, A. D. 1908, a petition signed by J M Parker and 23 others, was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of the County and State aforesaid, praying for the Vacation of a certain road, described as follows, viz.:

Beginning about 40 Rods north of the South East corner of Section Twenty-Six and Running south between Sections Twenty-five (25) and Twenty-Six (26) and thirty-five (35) and thirty-six (36) Township 33 Range 16 E to a point where the proposed new road intersects said Road.

WHEREUPON, Said Board of County Commissioners appointed the following-named persons, viz.: J N Bradshaw and Frank Harding, as viewers, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the Place of Beginning, in Liberty Township, on the 1 day of January, A. D. 1909, and proceed to view said road, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof as the law directs.
