

Road Petitioned for by Geo. J. Pfister and others.

Order on Road Petition

AND NOW, On this 3 day of October, A. D. 1910, being one of the days of the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, begun and holden on the 3 day of October, A. D. 1910, there was presented to said Board for their consideration, a petition signed by Geo. J. Pfister and thirty-six others, praying for the location and establishment of a certain road, hereinafter described.

The Board do find as follows: First—That said petition is a legal one, and is signed by at least twelve householders of Montgomery County, Kansas, residing in the vicinity of the road prayed for. Second—That the proper bond required by law has been filed, signed by Geo. J. Pfister as principal and T. B. Hooper and A. J. Pritchett as sureties, which said bond is by the Board approved.

THEREUPON, The Board orders that a view and survey of said proposed location and establishment be had on the 1st day of November, A. D. 1910, and appoints G. F. Hite, H. D. Smith, and J. W. Savage, three disinterested householders of Montgomery County, as viewers of said road, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor of Montgomery County, at the place of beginning, in Parker Township, and proceed to view and survey the same, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof, as the law directs.

The Board further orders the County Clerk to prepare for publication, in the official newspaper of the County, a notice which shall contain a correct and pertinent description of said proposed location and establishment of road, which said notice is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ROAD NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That on the 3 day of October, A. D. 1910, a petition signed by Geo. J. Pfister and thirty-six others, was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of the County and State aforesaid, praying for the location and establishment of a certain road, described as follows, viz.:

Commencing at a point in the center of Road No. 102, 1050 feet East of the center of the Southwest quarter of Section 11, Town 34 South of Range 16, East; and running thence Southerly along the foot of the bluff and the Verdigris River through Sections Eleven, Fourteen and Twenty-three in said Township, and Range to and intersecting Road Number 382; thence Southerly following Road No. 382 to its intersection with road No. 77 thence continuing Southerly along and near the line of road 77 to the South line of Section 26, Township 34, Range 16, which said proposed road forms a connected roadway to City of Coffeyville, Kansas.
Providing that at least two culverts or bridges be constructed on the lands of Geo. J. Pfister, and at least one culvert or bridge on the land of John Ingram this which the said proposed road passes, high and wide enough to permit livestock of all kinds to pass thro and under said culverts and to thereafter maintained by the road authorities; and provided the said Ingram and Pfister and their heirs and assigns are to have this right perpetually as long as said proposed road is used by the public and as public road thro their respective lands

WHEREUPON, Said Board of County Commissioners appointed the following-named persons, viz.: G. F. Hite, H. D. Smith, and J. W. Savage, as viewers, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning, in Parker Township, on the 1st day of November, A. D. 1910, and proceed to view said road, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof as the law directs.

The Board finds thereon as follows: First—That notice of the view and survey of said _____ has been given by advertisement in the _____, a newspaper published and of general circulation in Montgomery County, Kansas, for two consecutive weeks, the last publication of which was not more than twenty days prior to the time appointed for the view and survey thereof, in pursuance of an order made at the _____, 19____, meeting of said Board; that a copy of said notice has been set up in the County Clerk's office, and in every municipal township through which any part of said road was designated to be _____, for at least twenty days next preceding the view and survey thereof. Second—That the proper notices have been given in writing to the owners and agents of owners through whose lands such road is proposed to be _____ at least six days prior to the view and survey thereof.

THEREFORE, Upon due consideration, and no legal objection having been made against the _____ of said road, and believing the same will be of public utility, it is ordered that the viewers' report of view, surveyor's report of survey, and his plat thereof, be accepted and adopted, and said road _____ in accordance therewith.


