## Order on Road Petition

AND NOW, On this 11 day of July, A. D. 1911, being one of the days of the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, begun and holden on the 11 day of July, A. D. 1911, there was presented to said Board for their consideration, a petition signed by A. L. Bird and 14 others, praying for the establishment of a certain road, hereinafter described.

The Board do find as follows: First—That said petition is a legal one, and is signed by at least twelve householders of Montgomery County, Kansas, residing in the vicinity of the road prayed for. Second—That the proper bond required by law has been filed, signed by A. L. Bird as principal and H. M. Casebeer and others, which said bond is by the Board approved.

THEREUPON, The Board orders that a view and survey of said proposed road be had on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of August, A. D. 1911, and appoints J. V. Graham, H. C. Courtright, and George Hill, three disinterested householders of Montgomery County, as viewers of said road, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor of Montgomery County, at the beginning place of beginning, in Cherry Township, and proceed to view and survey the same, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof, as the law directs.

The Board further orders the County Clerk to prepare for publication in the official newspaper of the County, a notice which shall contain a correct and pertinent description of said proposed establishment of road, which said notice is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

## ROAD NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of July, A. D. 1911, a petition signed by A. L. Bird and 14 others, was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of the County and State aforesaid, praying for the establishment of a certain road, described as follows, viz.:

Commencing at the Quarter post on the North line of Section Seven (7), in Township Thirty-two (32) South of Range Seventeen (17) East, and at the South end of Road Number Ninety-eight (98) and running Southerly about the Center of Section Seven (7) to intersection with road number three hundred eighty-three in said Section.

WHEREUPON, Said Board of County Commissioners appointed the following-named persons, viz.: J. V. Graham, H. C. Courtright, and Geo. Hill, as viewers, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning, in Cherry Township, on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of August, A. D. 1911, and proceed to view said road, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof as the law directs.

## FINAL ORDER.

NOW, On this day, being one of the days of the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County, Kansas, begun and holden on the 8 day of August, A. D. 1911, comes on for hearing the report of the viewers and surveyor upon the establishment of a road petitioned for by A. L. Bird and others, praying for the location & establishment of a road described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the Quarter post on the North line of Section Seven (7) in Township Thirty-two (32) South of Range Seventeen (17) East, at the South end of Road Number Ninety-eight (98) and running thence Southerly about through the center of Section Seven (7) to intersection with road number Three hundred eighty-three (383) in said Section.

The Board finds thereon as follows: First—That notice of the view and survey of said location & establishment has been given by advertisement in the Independence Daily Reporter, a newspaper published and of general circulation in Montgomery County, Kansas, for two consecutive weeks, the last publication of which was not more than twenty days prior to the time appointed for the view and survey thereof, in pursuance of an order made at the July 11<sup>th</sup>, 1911, meeting of said Board; that a copy of said notice has been set up in the County Clerk's office, and in every municipal township through which any part of said road was designated to be established, for at least twenty days next preceding the view and survey thereof. Second—That the proper notices have been given in writing to the owners and agents of owners through whose lands such road is proposed to be established at least six days prior to the view and survey thereof.

THEREFORE, Upon due consideration, and no legal objection having been made against the location & establishment of said road, and believing the same will be of public utility, it is ordered that the viewers' report of view, surveyor's report of survey, and his plat thereof, be accepted and adopted, and said road opened in accordance therewith.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the County Surveyor make a record of said road in the County Road Records, including field-notes and plat; also, that the County Surveyor notify the Trustee of Cherry Township to cause said road to be opened for public travel to a width of 50 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That warrants issue to the following-named persons, for amounts stated, in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment of said road, to wit:
