Vacation of Road Petitioned for by W. F. Wiley and others.

State of Kansas, Montgomery County, ss.

Order on Road Petition

AND NOW, On this 5th day of April, A. D. 1904, being one of the days of the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, begun and holden on the 5th day of April, A. D. 1904, there was presented to said Board for their consideration, a petition signed by W. F. Wiley and minors others, praying for the Vacation of a certain road, hereinafter described.

The Board do find as follows: First—That said petition is a legal one, and is signed by at least twelve householders of Montgomery County, Kansas, residing in the vicinity of the road prayed for. Second—That the proper bond required by law has been filed, signed by W. F. Wiley as principal and _____ as sureties, which said bond is by the Board approved.

THEREUPON, The Board orders that a view and survey of said proposed vacation of road be had on the 20th day of May, A. D. 1904, and appoints A. J. Sullivan and C. C. Paxson, three disinterested householders of Montgomery County, as viewers of said road, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor of Montgomery County, at the place of beginning of said proposed vacation road, in Rutland Township, and proceed to view and survey the same, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof, as the law directs.

The Board further orders the County Clerk to prepare for publication, in the official newspaper of the County, a notice which shall contain a correct and pertinent description of said proposed vacation of road, which said notice is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ROAD NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That on the 5th day of April, A. D. 1904, a petition signed by W. F. Wiley and minors others, was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of the County and State aforesaid, praying for the Vacation of a certain road, described as follows, viz.: That portion of Road No. 30 lying South and adjoining the South 1/2 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 24, Township 33, Range 14, East. Also that part of Road No. 216 lying West and adjoining the South 1/2 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 24, Township 33, Range 14, East. Also that part of Road No. 216 from the Southwest corner of Section 24, Township and Range as above, South to a point about 20 rods South of said Southwest corner of said Section 24. Also that part of Road No. 30 beginning at the Southeast corner of Section 23, running West about 23 rods.

WHEREUPON, Said Board of County Commissioners appointed the following-named persons, viz.: A. J. Sullivan and C. C. Paxson, as viewers, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning of said road to be vacated, in Rutland Township, on the 20th day of May, A. D. 1904, and proceed to view said road, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof as the law directs.

The Board finds thereon as follows: First—That notice of the view and survey of said _____ has been given by advertisement in the _____, a newspaper published and of general circulation in Montgomery County, Kansas, for two consecutive weeks, the last publication of which was not more than twenty days prior to the time appointed for the view and survey thereof, in pursuance of an order made at the _____, 19____, meeting of said Board; that a copy of said notice has been set up in the County Clerk's office, and in every municipal township through which any part of said road was designated to be _____, for at least twenty days next preceding the view and survey thereof. Second—That the proper notices have been given in writing to the owners and agents of owners through whose lands such road is proposed to be _____ at least six days prior to the view and survey thereof.

THEREFORE, Upon due consideration, and no legal objection having been made against the _____ of said road, and believing the same will be of public utility, it is ordered that the viewers' report of view, surveyor's report of survey, and his plat thereof, be accepted and adopted, and said road _____ in accordance therewith.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the _____ make a record of said road in the County Road Records, including field-notes and plat; also, that the _____ notify the Trustee of _____ Township to cause said road to be _____ for public travel to a width of _____ feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That warrants issue to the following-named persons, for amounts stated, in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment of said road, to wit:
