

FIELD NOTES OF SURVEY NO.

Hamilton & Carl, Manufacturers, Topeka, Kansas.

I S. L. Hibbard County Surveyor of Montgomery County Kansas
 Was ordered by A. Mendenhall, S. P. Salby, L. G. Gladfelter & J. M. Burns
 (L. G. Gladfelter his agent) to Survey and establish necessary corners
 in Section 6, T. 34, R. 14 E. Without the six days Notice to the above named
 parties, as all the parties had agreed to have the Survey Made immediately
 April 8th 1891. I proceeded to Survey and Establish the corners to the above
 described section. John Hook and Albert Foster were selected as
 chain men and were duly sworn. I found the South West corner
 of Section 6. Standing, I ran from this corner S. 89° 30' E. at 2660 ft.
 Drawn stake or temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ post at the end of a hedge this being a fractional
 $\frac{1}{4}$, Then East at 5308 ft drawn stake as temporary corner to Lots 5, 6, 7, 8.
 I then ran N. 0° 30' E. at 1322 ft drawn stake at 2640 drawn stake as temporary $\frac{1}{4}$
 post at 3958 ft found also a corner on the Bluff marked $\frac{1}{8}$ (Sandstone)
 as N.E. corner of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Fractional 6. I then connected the temporary
 $\frac{1}{4}$ post on the east line of Section 6. 2 ft south here I set a sand stone
 $20'' \times 12'' \times 4''$ marked $\frac{1}{4}$, at 1320 ft S. 0° 30' W. from the $\frac{1}{4}$ post. I set a lime stone
 $6'' \times 6'' \times 24''$ as the N.E. corner to the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 6. At the S.E. corner of
 Section 6. I set a sand stone $20'' \times 12'' \times 8''$ marked 1111. For $\frac{1}{4}$ post on
 the South line of Section 6. at a point 2 ft south of the temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ post for
 Correction I set a lime $12'' \times 24'' \times 20'' \times 4''$ marked $\frac{1}{4}$. This stone is 2660 ft from
 the South West corner, and 2648 ft from the S.E. corner of Section 6. Government
 field notes giving the South line of the West $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6 as being
 12 ft longer than that of the East $\frac{1}{4}$, the extra 16 ft. Post was given to Euclidine
 as the other two one quarter posts were standing. Ran straight lines
 between them, and at their intersection established the center of
 Section 6. here I set a sand stone $20'' \times 8'' \times 4''$ marked 11.


