

Road Petitioned for by G. H. Barrinder and others.

Order on Road Petition

AND NOW, On this 27 day of August, A. D. 1907, being one of the days of the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, begun and holden on the 27 day of August, A. D. 1907, there was presented to said Board for their consideration, a petition signed by G. H. Barrinder and 17 others, praying for the Location of a certain road, hereinafter described.

The Board do find as follows: First—That said petition is a legal one, and is signed by at least twelve householders of Montgomery County, Kansas, residing in the vicinity of the road prayed for. Second—That the proper bond required by law has been filed, signed by G. H. Barrinder as principal and J. J. Mackel and J. H. Graves as sureties, which said bond is by the Board approved.

THEREUPON, The Board orders that a view and survey of said proposed Hagen Road be had on the 26 day of Sept, A. D. 1907, and appoints Isaac Archer, J. H. Graves, and Ross Trostall, three disinterested householders of Montgomery County, as viewers of said road, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor of Montgomery County, at the designated place of Beginning, in Caney Township, and proceed to view and survey the same, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof, as the law directs.

The Board further orders the County Clerk to prepare for publication, in the official newspaper of the County, a notice which shall contain a correct and pertinent description of said proposed Location of road, which said notice is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ROAD NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That on the 27 day of August, A. D. 1907, a petition signed by G. H. Barrinder and 17 others, was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of the County and State aforesaid, praying for the Location of a certain road, described as follows, viz.: Commencing at The Northwest corner of the South East quarter of the South East quarter of Section seven Township Thirty five Range 14 East Running thence South one half a mile to the South West corner of the Northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 18 Township 35 Range 14 East. Running thence east one half a mile on the quarter Section line to the Intersection of section line at the South East corner of NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 Section 18 Township 35 Range 14 all in Caney Township Montgomery County Kansas The Road running North and to be 40 ft in width and East and West 30 ft in width.

WHEREUPON, Said Board of County Commissioners appointed the following-named persons, viz.: Isaac Archer, J. H. Graves, and Ross Trostall, as viewers, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the Place of Beginning, in Caney Township, on the 26 day of Sept, A. D. 1907, and proceed to view said road, give to all parties a hearing, and make report thereof as the law directs.

FINAL ORDER.

NOW, On this day, being one of the days of the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County, Kansas, begun and holden on the 7 day of Oct, A. D. 1907, comes on for hearing the report of the viewers and surveyor upon the Location of a road petitioned for by G. H. Barrinder and others, praying for the Location + Establishment of a road described as follows, to wit:

I started at the SE cor of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Sec 18 Twp 35 Range 14 East by order of Viewers I ran west on 16" line to the SW cor of the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Sec 18 Twp 35 Range 14 East. That said Road on above line shall be 40 ft wide. 30 ft on South Side of Line and 10 feet North side of Line. And from the SW cor I ran north by order of the Viewers on the 1/4 line 26.35 ft to the NW cor of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Sec 7 Twp 35 Range 14 East same to be 40 feet wide and all on east side of 1/4 line.

The Board finds thereon as follows: First—That notice of the view and survey of said Proposed Road has been given by advertisement in the Coffeyville Journal, a newspaper published and of general circulation in Montgomery County, Kansas, for two consecutive weeks, the last publication of which was not more than twenty days prior to the time appointed for the view and survey thereof, in pursuance of an order made at the August 27, 1907, meeting of said Board; that a copy of said notice has been set up in the County Clerk's office, and in every municipal township through which any part of said road was designated to be Established, for at least twenty days next preceding the view and survey thereof. Second—That the proper notices have been given in writing to the owners and agents of owners through whose lands such road is proposed to be Established at least six days prior to the view and survey thereof.

THEREFORE, Upon due consideration, and no legal objection having been made against the Location of said road, and believing the same will be of public utility, it is ordered that the viewers' report of view, surveyor's report of survey, and his plat thereof, be accepted and adopted, and said road Established in accordance therewith.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the Surveyor make a record of said road in the County Road Records, including field-notes and plat; also, that the County Clerk notify the Trustee of Caney Township to cause said road to be Established for public travel to a width of 40 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That warrants issue to the following-named persons, for amounts stated, in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment of said road, to wit:
