HISTORICAL SOCIETY - 2024 BUDGET REQUEST:

FINANCIAL OFFICER - OPIOID PROGRAM:

Financial Officer Fred Gress met with the Board and presented a proposed memo of Understanding from the Youth Substance Prevention Task Force. Four County Mental Health has also been contacted but he is still waiting for a telephone call from them.
